Entry fee per horse for all competitions: € 300,00 (Euro), excl. VAT; stabling for each horse participating in the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 is free of charge. ✓

First bedding for horses is provided free of charge; food and additional bedding will be available within the stable area, at a price of € 6,00 (Euro), excl. VAT per bale for hay and € 9,00 (Euro), excl. VAT per bale for shavings.

MCP-fee: € 8,00 (Euro), excl. VAT per horse. This fee must be paid for each horse entered for the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010.

According to the relevant Dutch tax regulations, the Organising Committee of CDI -W Amsterdam – 2010 must charge 6% VAT on all fees to be paid by competitors.

Competitors will receive an invoice, showing VAT specified separately and can apply for re-imburement of all VAT paid at the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 by filling out a form to request this refund of VAT by the Dutch tax authorities.

within six months maximum after the end of the year in which the event took place. Requests for amounts smaller than € (EUR) 27,00 will not be taken into consideration. Any such request can be handed in once a year only.

All entry and MCP-fees to be paid at the secretary's office on Sunday, January 24th, 2010 at the latest. The account will be made, based upon the definite entries. Payments must be made in € (Euro) in cash or by credit card.

An ATM will be available at the show office as well. Payments by credit card will be debited by 6% extra over the total amount due. Extra costs for payments by cheque will be € (Euro) 25,00, excl. VAT.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to withhold money due from the eventual prize money won, as long as outstanding bills have not been paid.

No show consequences

Riders not showing up, following a definite entry of their horses, will afterwards be charged - via their respective NFs - with all stabling fees i.e. € (Euro) 150,00 excl. 6% VAT per horse, definitely entered for the event, and with hotel expenses due, according their specific hotel reservation.

General

Entries are accepted subject to any unforeseen circumstances including but not limited to military exigencies, strikes, or other civil disturbances, fire or other contingencies of any description preventing or rendering it undesirable in the opinion of the Organising Committee for the Show to take place.

All entries shall stand for any postponed show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Show Secretary within one week of notification or public announcement in the press of such postponement.

The postponement or abandonment of the show either before the opening or at any time during the course of the show shall not give rise to any claim whatever against the show or the Organising Committee by the competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entries in respect of classes or competitions not held. In the case of postponement refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn.

Declining entries

The Organising Committee may at their absolute discretion, with Ground Jury approval, remove any person or animal from the event without being liable for any compensation.

No decision will however be taken by the Organising Committee relating to riders and/or horses participating in international competition without the approval of the Ground Jury.

A) Officials

Officials will be the guest of the Organising Committee; hotel accommodation, breakfast, lunch and dinner will be paid by the Organising Committee (extra's: telephone, charges for the use of the internet, beverages, drinks etc. not included). ✓

The hotel rooms will be reserved by the Organising Committee. Costs will be paid for a maximum of three nights, as from Thursday January 21st, 2010 (arrival date) until Sunday January 24th, 2010 (departure date). A longer stay will be at the expense of those concerned. Officials staying in a hotel other than the one selected by the Organising Committee, will have to pay all expenses incurred themselves.

B) Competitors

CDI-W competitors will be the guests of the Organising Committee. Costs will be paid for a maximum of two nights, from Thursday January 21st, 2010 (arrival date) until Saturday January 23rd, 2010 (departure date). If a foreign competitor prefers to stay until Sunday January 24th, 2010, the Organising Committee will cover the expenses of the extra night as well; this must however specifically be requested with the definite entries of the foreign rider concerned.

Any stay longer than three nights will be at the expense of those concerned. Competitors staying in a hotel other than the one selected by the Organising Committee, will have to pay all expenses incurred themselves. ✓

Breakfast will be served at the hotel at OC's expense; lunch and dinner will be served at a location designated by the OC in the Amsterdam RAI at OC's expense. Lunch and dinner vouchers for competitor's partners and for horse owners will be for sale at the location where lunch and dinner are being served.

✓

C) Grooms

Grooms (maximum 1 per rider) will stay at the event at their own expense; requests for accommodation must be sent with the definite entries. Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served at a location designated by the Organising Committee in the Amsterdam RAI at OC's expense. The Organising Committee will provide sufficient clean sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water, for male and female grooms. ✓

All competitors (both foreign and home riders) are kindly invited to send their requests for hotel accommodation with their definite entries!

If this deadline is not respected, availability of hotel accommodation cannot be guaranteed!

D) Horses

All horses entered for the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 must be 8 or more years old.

Accommodation for their horses will be available for home and foreign competitors in temporary stables, 3 x 3 metres, from Thursday January 21st, 2010 / 11hrs00 am for the entire duration of the event, on through Monday January 25th, 2010 / 09hrs00 am. ✓

Since stabling is limited, basically there are no stable boxes available for horses that do not participate in the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010. However, if the Organising Committee approves in advance the stabling of an extra horse, an amount of € 175,00 excl. 6% VAT per horse will be charged for each horse not competing in the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010. Requests for extra boxes must be sent in writing, with the definite entries.

Cancellation of stabling:

Applications for refund of charges, received by the Organising Committee later than Monday January 11th, 2010 will under no circumstances be considered.

Transport of horses

All transport expenses to be paid by the competitors themselves; there will be no reimbursement of travelling expenses by the Organising Committee.

E) Welcome

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the Organising Committee in order to facilitate them on arrival. However, horses may not arrive earlier than Thursday January 21st, 2010 / 11hrs00 am and must depart no later than Monday January 25th, 2010 / 09hrs00 am, unless otherwise agreed upon in advance with the Organising Committee.

→ **Attention:** Due to construction works, the horse trucks will possibly be parked at some distance (approximately 1 km) away from the event venue. The parking lot will be provided with sanitary facilities and will be guarded 24 hours a day. Shuttle services between lorry parking and the event hall will be

available. Nevertheless the Organising Committee recommends groomers – if possible – to bring a bicycle to the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010.

F) Local transportation

Courtesy cars will be available for transport from the official event hotel to the Amsterdam RAI vice versa. The service will start on Thursday January 21st, 2010 and will be continued up to and including Sunday January 24th 2010. Courtesy car services will be available daily until one hour after the finish of the last competition of the day.

G) Advertising and publicity on competitors and horses

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with FEI-GR Art. 136. The Chief Steward will however be responsible to ensure that, before allowing competitors into the arena to compete, the sponsor logos on the saddle cloth and on riders' clothing are within the limitations as laid down in art. 136 of the FEI General Regulations. ✓

Competitors not complying with art. 136 will be reported to the Ground Jury and will not be permitted into the arena during the course of the competition, until the use of the sponsor's logo is in compliance with this article.

H) Dogs

Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times; offences against this rule may lead to permanent withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

I) Open scoring

There will be open scoring. As per regulations: not visible to judges and competitors.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

A) PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Following each competition a distribution of prizes will take place; for the FEI World Cup™ competition the competitors up to and including 8th place will be invited to attend to the prize giving ceremony. The owner(s) of the winning horse of the FEI World Cup™ competition is (are) entitled to attend to the prize giving ceremony.

B) DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Allocation of money prizes will be based on one prize for each four competitors, with a minimum of five prizes per competition. Prize money will be paid on Saturday January 23rd 2010, after the last start of the competitor in € (Euro).

In accordance with the relevant specific Dutch tax regulations, no income tax will be deducted from prizes won by home riders or by foreign riders from a country with which the Netherlands have made a treaty in order to avoid double income tax levies.

However, 20% income tax will be deducted from prize money won by foreign competitors, domiciled in a country with which The Netherlands do not have a similar tax treaty.

In all cases, competitors will be invited to provide all necessary information, in order to guarantee the correct tax procedure; to this purpose all competitors must provide the Organising Committee with a copy of the relevant pages of their passport and their home address. Every competitor is responsible for the correctness of the details he/she submits.

Up to the amount of € 500,= maximum, prize money will be paid by the Organising Committee in cash to the relevant competitor; in case the amount of prize money won exceeds the maximum mentioned above, prize money will be transferred to the competitor's bank account, within two weeks following the closure of the event.

C) INSURANCES

The Organising Committee will not accept responsibility for any accident happening to owners, participants, grooms, to or because of their horses to third parties in whichever circumstances, inside or outside the showgrounds, during, before or after competitions.

The civil and financial responsibility of the Organising Committee and its cooperators will never be liable in any circumstance.

All owners and competitors will be personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

D) RESPONSIBILITY

The Organising Committee (including their employees, representatives and show officials) will not be responsible for any accident, injury or damage that may occur to, or any illness or disease which may be contracted by any horse entered at the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 however occurring, and the competitors shall keep the Organising Committee indemnified against all liability whatever arising from any accident, injury, damage, illness or disease.

The Organisers will not be in any way liable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to property brought into the event or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatever in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the actions of the Organising Committee (including their employees, representatives and show officials) or any of their officers, or agents or these or any other rules or regulations special conditions prescribed by the event.

Each competitor will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of his horses and for any other servants or agents of his for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these rules and regulations.

E) EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury the Organising Committee reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes will be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they will be reported to the Secretary General of the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

All modifications made to the schedule after approval by the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) must have the approval of the Secretary General of the FEI.

Having received FEI Dressage Department and Ground Jury approval, the Organising Committee may alter the timings or cancel any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to take all necessary action, including cancelling or shortening the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010, due to special and/or unforeseen circumstances, which in the opinion of the Organising Committee, would make the continuation of the event unjustified; any such

decision will be taken in agreement with the Secretary General of the FEI. No consequential liability whatsoever can be accepted in such occasion. Gen.Reg. 115.1 and 115.2. Entry fees paid will however be returned.

G) GENERAL

Competitors and others involved in the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 must make themselves conversant with these general regulations in addition to the special conditions applicable to the various competitions. Riders may only compete on the understanding that they comply with, and are bound by these regulations and the special conditions relating to each competition.

3. DOCTOR / MEDICAL SERVICE / FARRIER

Veterinary and medical assistance, as well as farriery services, are available for the duration of the event. These are at the expense of those requesting them.

When, in the opinion of the Show's veterinary surgeon, a horse is so severely injured that it ought to be humanely destroyed, the Person Responsible should where possible first be informed. However, the Show's veterinary surgeon may proceed with humane destruction, without reference to the PR, in order to prevent undue suffering to the horse.

Before taking this action, the Show's veterinary surgeon should, wherever practicable, seek a second veterinary opinion. In such eventuality, owners are responsible for the cost of disposal.

4. PRIVATE VETERINARY SURGEONS

Private veterinaries will have to report to the FEI Veterinary Delegate upon their arrival at the show grounds, before they will be accredited and be allowed to enter the restricted area. Under no circumstance will any veterinary surgeon other than the veterinary commission be allowed to treat any horse at the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010, unless permission in writing has been received from the FEI Veterinary Delegate. If permission is given, the veterinary concerned will be accompanied by the FEI Veterinary Delegate or his representative.

5. STABLES

All horses, entered for the competitions of the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010 must be stabled in the official stables provided by the Organising Committee (immediately following the official horse inspection) for the entire duration of the event. They are not to be removed between Thursday January 21st, 2010 and one hour following the prize giving ceremony of the last competition in which they have participated.

6. NO SMOKING

Smoking inside the stables is strictly prohibited; offences against this rule, first will incur a fine and in case of a repeated offence, will lead to permanent exclusion from the stables by withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

7. EMERGENCY STABLE CARDS

ECSCs must be obtained from the stable managers office upon arrival at the event. It is the responsibility of the rider/groom to complete the card in full and affix to their horses stable door for the duration of their stay at the show.

Whilst every reasonable effort will be made to contact the owner/person responsible of the animal, if unsuccessful the Veterinary Surgeon on duty will treat the animal as he finds necessary.

8. IDENTIFICATION

For identification purpose all horses stabled must carry their identification number whenever leaving the stables; offences against this rule, will incur a fine.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

These will be carried out in accordance with the “Veterinary Regulations”, Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

“General Regulations”, 23rd Edition, effective 1st January 2009 will apply:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart.

In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

2. VETERINARY ASPECTS "B"

A) CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

The competitors must arrange their own transportation of horses and are moreover responsible for arranging correct custom formalities. Non EC-competitors are strongly advised to travel with an ATA-Carnet;

X. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of € 100,00 or CHF 150,00; protests must be delivered by the Person Responsible to the President of the Ground Jury personally and must be lodged, together with any supporting evidence and names of witnesses, within the time limits as laid down in FEI-GR, art. 167-7.

2. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

There will be free access to the show grounds for the competitors, their partners, grooms, owners of participating horses and officials. The necessary accreditation should be collected from the secretary's office upon arrival. Per competitor 1 groom maximum will be accredited.

A maximum of two owners per participating horse, will be accredited, providing their names are duly registered as such in the official FEI-passport of the relevant horse. The Organising Committee reserves the right to withdraw, confiscate or otherwise any passes whether issued with entry or purchased, without refund, immediately in the event that they are either cut, removed or in any way damaged.

Passes are non-transferable once issued. All competitors, owners, grooms and other persons must display relevant passes at all times, otherwise entry will be refused.

3. START LISTS & RESULT SHEETS

The name of the owner of each horse will be added to all start lists and result sheets, as well as its stud book initials, country of birth, sex, colour and age.

4. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of this schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. DECLARATIONS

No horse will be allowed to start in more than one competition per day. Moreover no horse will be permitted to compete in any competition, unless the declaration has been made within the specified time; i.e.:

a) Horses participating in the competitions on Friday (January 22nd, 2010) must be declared immediately following the official Horse Inspection of all horses on Thursday January 21st 2010, but in any case at 18hrs00 hrs pm at the latest, at the sports office;

b) Horses starting in the competitions on Saturday (January 23rd, 2010) must be declared on the day before at the secretary's office, at the latest 60 minutes after the prize giving ceremony of the Grand Prix dressage competition.

After declaration no substitution of horses will be permitted, unless the Event Veterinarian certifies officially, that the declared horse has become unfit to compete since the time of declaration.

The final decision about the substitution is however at the discretion of the Ground Jury, after consultation with the Event Veterinarian.

6. PRACTICE ARENA

Training (including working, lunging and walking) of horses is only allowed at specified times on the official and controlled exercise areas, provided by the Organising Committee from Thursday January 21st, 2010 (immediately after the Horse Inspection) until the conclusion of the event on Sunday (January 24th, 2010). The exercise / practice areas will be permanently controlled by FEI stewards.

During a competition the exercise/practice area is strictly reserved to horses starting in the present competition and the next three competitors must be mounted and ready to enter the arena.

If a competitor is not ready when his/her starting number/name is called, he/she will lose his/her place in the starting order and he/she will be eliminated from that competition at the discretion of the Ground Jury, unless certain circumstances prevent this (e.g. losing a horse shoe just before his/her turn to start).

7. IMAGE RIGHTS

The Organising Committee reserves the right to use – without any compensation due – photographs, slides, video tapes or any other (digital) registered picture from riders and/or horses, made or registered during the CDI-W Amsterdam – 2010, for promotional and/or marketing purposes, related to the event.

It is a condition of entry that all competitors will permit any photographic or filmed material derived during the course of the event, to be utilised subsequently by the Organising Committee for future promotion of their business interests or the show at no cost to the latter.

8. INCIVILITY

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any judge, steward or any show officials on the part of the competitor, groom, driver or agent of a horse may at the discretion of the President of the Ground Jury disqualify that horse from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

9. PARADING

All horses must be paraded whenever so ordered by the Organising Committee or by an authorised show official. Any failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification from competing and forfeiture of prizes, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.

10. FINAL CONDITION

By entering a horse into the CDI-W Amsterdam (NED) – 2010, the Person Responsible fully accepts the conditions of the schedule and of the program itself, applicable for the competitors, grooms and horses.
